One BC staff member recently reported, upon returning to home in Vermont from some out-ofstate school vacation time, that the experience was like moving "from winter to April". Indeed, here in Vermont, the weather has been most unusual. Here just days before January 1, we have light rain falling, no snow on the ground, and 50 degrees of warm temperature.

The weather, in part, as we all know, is responding to climate change. For BC community members around the world, I am confident we have done small and possibly big things to help return our planet to balance including donating funds from third-session Popsicle Racers to organizations working on climate action. We have done so for many summers and will do that again in 2024. Third-session people! Start thinking about organizations we could support!

Without snow on the ground, I find that I notice different activity and different natural world winter phenomena as I walk daily around BC and Sangamon. First of all, on the day we joined people around the world for a celebration of the winter solstice here in the northern hemisphere, it actually was 10 degrees outside! My walk took me over a few very interesting winter puddles.

parking lot, my car was

decorated with beautiful frost flowers. So were the windows in the BC vans and the Farmhouse. Lovely!





Did you know "frost flowers" and designs are the result of molecules repeating designs as very cold surfaces encounter warmer surfaces inside our homes and cars. If there are tiny scratches or dust on the very cold surface, the designs will vary! I also noticed ice thorns on branches large and small. "Nature is an amazingly creative force", said one author in speaking about frost.





The Solstice day was the coldest day we have had here at camp. When warm weather returned, I noticed different amazing things seen more easily because there are no leaves on the trees and no snow cover. I notice the designs tree branches make on those maples and oaks around camp-the ones that lose their leaves. And of course, our evergreens stand out regardless, happily proving to any observer, that resilience is possible in the natural world! I was grateful for the gift of some evergreen branches to decorate the Blueberry Hill Hotel and the Lodge.



Down at the pond, when it was 10 degrees, a thin ice film covered the surface, hints (we hope) of more ice to skate on later in the winter! Pond ice freezes in its own unique designs, but larger sheet designs rather than the flowers and ferns I saw on the car windows.

All around camp, the birds are around to sing almost as loudly as you all sing in the dining room...well almost. Without leaves, I see woodpeckers, doves, chickadees, blue jays, and many others. We have feeders at the Farmhouse and it is interesting to watch the species interact! The doves sit on the tree branches waiting for their turn at the feeders. Blue Jays and Chickadees and Woodpeckers seem to seize first chance. The doves remind me of all of us patiently waiting (mostly!) for the meal bells threetimes a day at camp.

Keep your sharp eyes on the ready this winter, whether or not there is snow on the ground where you are. There are amazing things to see!
